My name is probably familiar to you already from my arts presentations, and the classes I have given, not to mention volunteering at the front desk for the last four years! As of February 2014 I have taken over the torch of curatorial responsibility.

I am an art historian and curator by education, with Master's Degrees from the University of Toronto and York University. My special interests range from digital media to languages and...good chocolate!

I am thrilled to be able to bring my experience and enthusiasm to the Georgina Arts Centre & Gallery, and I look forward to working with this great team.

I have a lot of plans, which I shall write about as they unfold. The first step will be to expand the aboriginal component and give it a space where there is proper lighting and proper exhibition conditions. This will happen in March – be sure to come and see!
